What makes this board different than the rest is that the size is usually smaller, as well as it is touch sensitive. It’s not the only interactive board to be touch sensitive but it is the most prominent. Another feature that makes this board easy to identify and is different from all the other boards is the pens and pen holder in the front of the board. It makes the board easier to use because the user can pick up the desired pen and begin writing.
